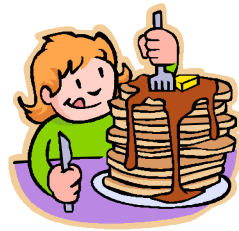

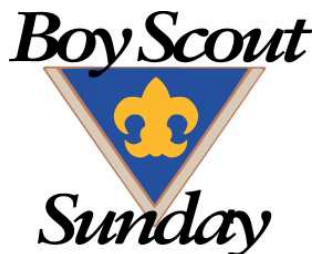

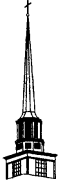
## **BOY SCOUT SUNDAY IS FEBRUARY 3.**

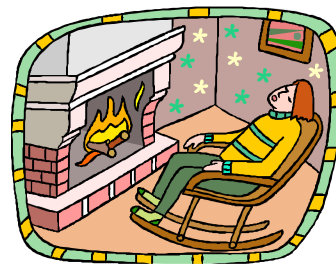

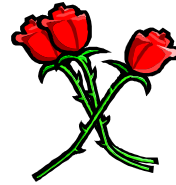

## STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Stewardship means giving of ourselves. The concept is illustrated by saying, "Give Christ all the keys." Keys lock and unlock. We must give Christ the keys to all of our lives. Every corner of our lives should be unlocked to Him.



In South Africa, you will find the Babemba tribe. Within that community, antisocial or criminal behavior is rare. However, when it does occur, the Babemba have an interesting and beautifully creative way of dealing with it. If a member of the tribe acts irresponsibly, they are placed at the center of the village. Work stops, and every man, woman and child in the village gathers around the accused in a large circle. Then, one at a time, each individual, including the children, call out all the good things the person in the center of the ring has done previously. All the positive attributes and the kind acts are recited carefully and at length. No one is permitted to exaggerate or be facetious. The ceremony may last for several days and doesn't stop until everyone is drained of

every positive comment they can muster about the transgressor. Not one word of criticism is permitted concerning the accused. At the end, the tribal circle breaks up and there is a great celebration, where he or she is welcomed back into the community.

Apparently this overwhelming, positive bombardment strengthens the self-esteem of the accused and causes that person to resolve to live up to the expectations of the tribe. Proof of the success of this creative response to wrongdoing seems evident in the fact that these ceremonies are quite rare. One wonders if, perhaps, borrowing from this technique might be a good idea, at least in certain family situations in which a member has gone astray. "By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). Join us at church Sunday!

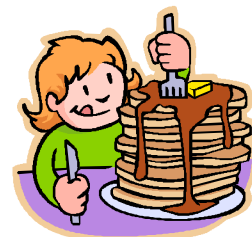

## YEAR END REPORT

It was a year of change at Lewisville UM Church. With the final reports coming in, Lewisville UMC ended 2007 with all financial commitments paid, including 100% of District and Conference askings. For the year, we received a total of \$401,394.88 on a budget of \$434,364.00. Total expenses for all causes in 2007 was \$424,129.12.

As of December 31, 2007 our church membership was 887. In 2007 we received 27 new members including 7 professions of faith. We lost 6 of our fellowship to death. We also had membership transfers or withdrawals of 22 others. We also had 10 baptisms (8 infant, 2 youth).

Average worship attendance for 2007 was 289 (8:30 service: 119; 11:00 service: 170). Sunday School attendance averaged 164. Overall it was an excellent year with God's abundant blessings upon His church. Our praise is to the glory of God and our thanks to the faithfulness of those a part of Lewisville UMC.

## 2008 BUDGET APPROVED

The Administrative Board gave final approval to a 2008 budget plan presented by the Finance Committee for \$465,583, an increase of 6.7% over 2007. This 2008 budget plan reflects a growing church with financial needs that reflect that growth. Our thanks to the Finance Committee and Administrative Board for their excellent leadership in guiding our church. Copies of the 2008 Budget will be available in the church office.

**Lewisville United Methodist Church now sells Food Lion Gift Cards as a fundraiser for the church Building Fund.**

It works like this: The church purchases the cards from Food Lion and receives a 5% discount. When cards are purchased from the church, they are sold at face value as \$100.00 or \$50.00 cards. The purchaser gets full value from the cards when shopping at Food Lion.

What an easy way to help our church retire the Building Fund debt. While 5% may not sound like much, it adds up over time. One example would be if 20 families purchased a \$100.00 FL gift card per week, the church would benefit by \$5200.00 each year. Also, you may know of a family that would benefit from a gift card especially during the Christmas season.

## SPECIAL SESSION OF WNCC ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Bishop Lawrence McCleskey and the Cabinet have approved a special called session of the WNCC on February 2<sup>nd</sup> at 9:30 a.m. at the Hickory Metro Center. Delegates to the June 2007 session at Lake Junaluska are to be delegates to this called session. Purpose of the session is to receive and act upon the final report of the Conference Reorganization Task Force. The report is available on the WNCC web site, [www.wnccumc.org](http://www.wnccumc.org) and click the link on "Task force releases final reorganization report."

Highlights of the report: that there be "Formation of Covenant Peer Groups" set up for both clergy and laity; the addition of one District bringing the total to 15 districts with the creation of the Lake Norman District; simplification of board/agency/committee structure by replacing the current Conference Ministries Advisory Council (CMAC) with the WNCC Connectional Table with three work areas (Church and Society, Discipleship and Religion and Race); formation of a Board of Congregational Development where District superintendents would be key in congregational development; recommends that the Conference Memorial Center remain at Shamrock Drive in Charlotte for the immediate future; and consideration of an amended 2008 budget based upon reorganization changes.

Your prayers are sought for wisdom and God's direction, as the Annual Conference meets on Feb. 2<sup>nd</sup>.
