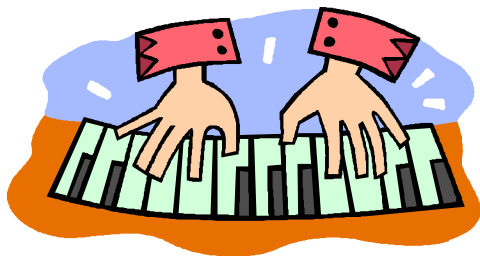

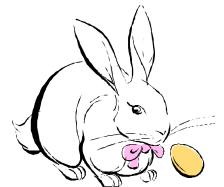
Cathy Lewis is collecting hats for Cancer Services.

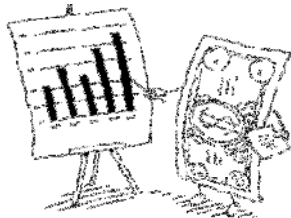

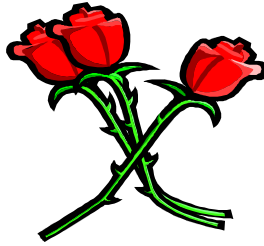

Easter is the day we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. And it is also the day we sing a favorite hymn of many, "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today." So, I decided to do some research about the hymn itself. "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" was written by Charles Wesley, 1707-1788, who was the brother of John Wesley, founder of Methodism. It was written just one year after John Wesley's "heart-warming" experience at the Aldersgate Street in London. As John Wesley started organizing Methodist Societies, they needed a place to meet. The place they found was a deserted iron foundry that had been used to make weapons. It became known as the Foundry Meeting House. When it came time for the first service at the Foundry, Charles Wesley decided to write a special hymn for the occasion.

So, "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" was written for the first service in that chapel. We might say that as Methodism began, the first thought on the minds of our founding fathers was a celebration of the Risen Christ.

Revelation 1:17-18 says, "I am the first and the last, and the Living One; I died, and behold I am alive for evermore." What a glorious truth to grasp, that Jesus is not the "Great I WAS" but rather the "Great I AM!" He is not only a historical fact but a present-day, living presence with us. All of Christianity rests upon the truth that Jesus Christ rose from the grave and is now seated at the Father's right hand as our personal advocate. The Resurrection assures us of God's tomorrow. This anticipation makes it possible to live joyfully today, regardless of life's circumstances. That's the spirit behind the hymn that says, "Christ the Lord is Risen today, Alleluia! Earth and heaven in chorus say, Alleluia! Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens, and earth reply: Alleluia!"

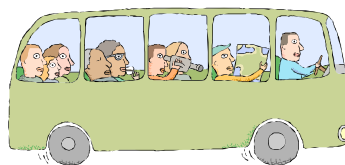

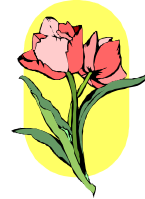
