All women of the church are invited and encouraged to be a part of UMW and its mission.



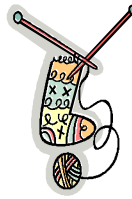
UMW READING GROUP

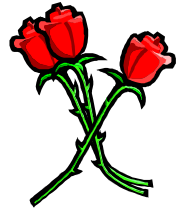

LEWISVILLE IS A STEPHEN MINISTRY CHURCH

This is care in addition to the care the pastor gives. STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Stewardship means giving of ourselves. The concept is illustrated by saying, "Give Christ all the keys." Keys lock and unlock. We must give Christ the keys to all of our lives. Every corner of our lives should be unlocked to Him.



Winston Churchill had planned his funeral, which took place in Saint Paul's Cathedral. He included many of the great hymns of the church and used the eloquent Anglican liturgy. At his direction, a bugler, positioned high in the dome of Saint Paul's, intoned, after the benediction, the sound of "Taps," the universal signal that says the day is over. But then came the most dramatic turn: as Churchill instructed, as soon as "Taps" was finished, another bugler, placed on the other side of the great dome, played the notes of Reveille, "It's time to get up. It's time to get up. It's time to get up in the

morning." Churchill's testimony was that at the end of history, the last note will not be "Taps;" it will be "Reveille."

Too many people today keep looking back. Some keep harking back to their conversion as if God had not spoken to them since that time. Of course, conversion is important, but it's only the beginning. The Holy Spirit is not idle. The Holy Spirit wants to lead us on to new heights of commitment and joy.

Of course, like the man who filled his barns (Luke 12:16-20), there comes to each of us a time when there is no tomorrow here on earth. But a Christian has a glorious hope. Even on the Christian's last day on earth, the affirmation still stands: "The greatest day of my life hasn't happened yet. It's tomorrow." Easter tells us so, because Jesus tasted death and came back to reveal God's power over death. Thus Jesus has given us the confidence that tomorrow can be better than today. If life for you has grown troublesome, things just aren't working out the way you had hoped, know that Easter gives us tomorrow. Easter tells us that things can change, hearts and lives can change. God is a God of new beginnings.

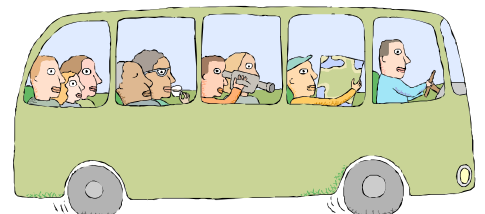
