The Costa Rica Mission Team would like to thank everybody who volunteered and attended the Touch-a-Truck fundraiser! It was a huge success and it would not have been



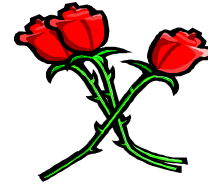

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

As God's stewards, we manage everything and own nothing. To think of our possessions as things that belong to us leads to pride; to think of things as gifts from God leads to a humble use of our resources for God.



I had the privilege of attending the memorial service for Bob Denning on April 30. Bob was a member of Lewisville UMC since 1980. He once lived in Lewisville until he moved to Jonestown Road in Winston-Salem. Bob was killed by burglars/intruders on April 23 in a senseless and tragic act of violence. Bill and Anne Magness went to Bob's home to deliver his Meals on Wheels and happened upon the burglary. Anne was shot and killed; Bill was shot and survived. Two suspects have been arrested.

When I say that I had the "privilege" of attending Bob's service, I say so because of the strong Christian faith and witness that was evident. Bob's son, Brian Denning, spoke of forgiveness and of his own faith that has seen him through this tragedy and how he hoped that everyone knew Jesus Christ in their life. Bob's sister, Judy McCurdy, also spoke of forgiveness and of her faith. She said that many have asked what they can do to help. To them, and to us, she said that there were two things she wanted us to do. (1) Don't make this senseless act, senseless. Instead, make something good come out of it. Remember those who are having a difficult time and special needs, reach out to them, do some good. She praised the Meals on Wheels volunteers for their commitment to help others. (2) Remember just how fragile life is, make the most of each and every day, and make sure that you are right with God.

Rev. Bob Cook, Bob's brother-in-law and a United Methodist pastor, spoke about his conversations with Bob about his faith. He told how Bob gave his life to Jesus years before and how he knew that "all was right" between Bob and God. Bob Denning was ready for whatever the future held for him. A stroke a few years ago left him with a number of limitations, but yet he pressed on, doing what he could.

The service was not about the tragic ending to Bob's life, neither was it all about Bob, but rather, it was a witness to Bob's faith and His Lord Jesus Christ. Learn from Bob and his family, be ready for whatever the future holds, forgive those who wrong you, and make sure you are right with God.

GENERAL CONFERENCE UPDATE

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church (the official voice of our denomination) met April 23-May 2 in Fort Worth, Texas. Here is a summary of the major actions taken:

The United Methodist Church in Côte d'Ivoire, a regional conference in the West African country, received its full rights and responsibilities as United Methodist.

The Conference approved a full communion agreement with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, in which each church recognizes the other's ministry and mission, the authenticity of the other's baptism and Eucharist, and the interchangeability of ordained ministers. The ELCA's assembly will act on the agreement in 2009.

The delegates approved a \$642 million denominational spending plan for the next four years built around four areas of focus for the immediate future: (1) Developing principled Christian leaders. (2) Creating new places for new people by starting new congregations and renewing existing ones. (3) Engaging in ministries with the poor. (4) Improving global health, especially attacking the killer diseases of poverty. The budget for 2009-2012 is 4.8 percent higher (1.2% a year) than the previous four years.

Delegates approved the creation of a hymnal revision committee and authorized it to bring a proposed hymnal to the 2012 General Conference.

On social issues: delegates urged U.S. lawmakers to ensure that immigration laws don't tear families apart, and they advocated for "full protection of all workers." Delegates called on United Methodists to divest funds from companies that support the government of Sudan in order to end the genocide in that area. The body encouraged the implementation of the universal school lunch program and also called for equal rights of men with regard to parental leave and child custody. They essentially upheld long-time statements related to homosexuality. They retained language defining marriage as a relationship between one man and one woman. The body did not take action concerning transgender pastors.

The assembly increased the retirement age of Bishops from 66 to 68 and the retirement age of other ordained clergy from 70 to 72. They also approved a plan that will result in one less bishop in four of the five U.S. jurisdictions, beginning in 2012.

In additional action, persons who join United Methodist churches henceforth will promise to be faithful in "their witness" as well as in their "prayers, their presence, their gifts and their service."

ASSISTANT TREASURER NEEDED

The Leadership Development Committee of Lewisville UMC is looking for an Assistant Treasurer for our church. This person will train with our current Treasurer, Bill Smith, in 2008, and look to take over the position in 2009. Strong bookkeeping and computer skills with financial software and Excel are needed. Person will need to learn how to use our church's PowerChurch financial software. Also, a knowledge of payroll skills (W-2's, quarterly tax reports) is needed. Time commitment varies with the week, with some around 3 hours and others (end of month) about 6 hours. End and start of year requires more. We are asking for a minimum two-year commitment for this volunteer position.

SECOND MILE GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

“Second Mile” Giving is the term used by the church that relates to financial giving beyond a person’s tithe or regular offering to the general budget fund. The general budget fund supports the ongoing costs of operating the church, utilities, maintenance, all the church’s programs, Sunday School, worship services, office expense, missions, salaries, etc. We depend on all our church family to support this need.

Because we are an alive and growing church, we have some needs that go beyond the general budget to which we encourage “second mile” giving, above and beyond regular budget giving. Here is a list of current opportunities that persons can choose to support as they can.

- (1) First and foremost is our Building Fund. The latest addition to Lewisville Church included needed classrooms and Fellowship Hall (cost was about \$1.9 million) and helped generate explosive growth to the church of around 100 members. We have two more years left on the loan that has a balance now of about \$415,000
- (2) Bus/Van Fund - As our church grows, transportation needs become a greater concern. We have a bus/van fund set up for the purchase of a small bus (15 passenger vans are being discouraged by insurance companies for safety reasons).
- (3) Parsonage Fund - Our church parsonage is about 19 years old and in need of repairs and updating. Some of what’s needed are a new roof, painting (inside and out) and other updating. Cost is estimated to be more than \$10,000. We recently (May 08) had to replace the upstairs heat pump that just wore out. Most items needing repair/updating are original to the house.
- (4) Office Folding Machine Fund - The church office is in great need of a new folding machine. Some funds have been given for this. Need is about \$2,500-\$3,000.
- (5) Africa University Fund - Our church made a pledge over 3 years on a Conference-wide campaign for Africa University. We still owe over \$1,000 due this year.
- (6) Flood Buckets - The Missions Committee continually seeks donations to make more flood buckets that are filled as directed by relief agencies and given to areas in disaster times. More buckets are assembled when we reach \$1,000 (\$518 now)..
- (7) Youth ministries - Our growing youth program has continual needs, but most urgent now is their mission trip this summer to Costa Rica.
- (8) The Children’s Home - The Winston-Salem District mission emphasis for 2008 is The Children’s Home. Goal for 2008 is \$4,435.

These and possibly other areas are opportunities we have to support particular needs of Lewisville Church.

NEW MINISTRY AT LEWISVILLE UMC

To enhance our communication ability, Lewisville UM Church has recently received the donation of a PhoneTree system for our church. The LUMC PhoneTree is an automated phone calling system where persons will be notified by phone for various activities and information. Messages can be left on answering devices. **We will seek to respect the privacy** of those in our church and use the system to notify only those who request it OR those who are part of specific areas of the church (ex.- notification of children and youth about events; notification of persons who are on various committees, councils, boards, work-areas and other small groups).

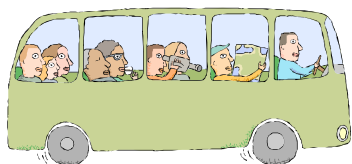

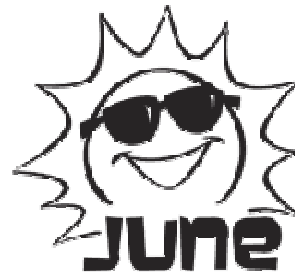
