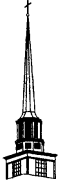
The movie is free, so come and enjoy the fellowship together. We will be watching the movie *WALL-E*. Hope to see you there!

**Sunday, September 6:** No Youth – Labor Day Weekend

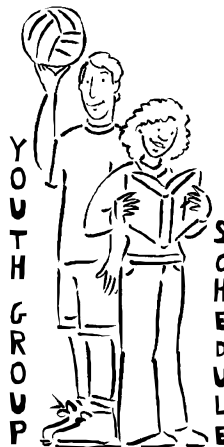
