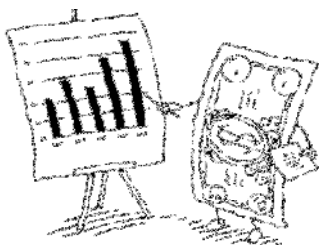

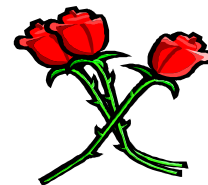


## Stewardship Update

## STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Stewardship means giving of ourselves. The concept is illustrated by saying, "give Christ all the keys." Keys lock and unlock. We must give Christ the keys to all of our lives. Every corner of our lives should be unlocked to Him.



Sadly, some churches embark upon their annual stewardship campaign with some feelings like going to the dentist for a root canal. Giving to the work of God through His church should be one of the greatest and most joyful things that we do. Our theme this year is “A Matter of the Heart.” And that is just what stewardship of giving is. At a seminar I recently attended, they offered some thoughts I want to share with you.

The first is for most of those in the church today. We were first brought to church by our parents. When growing up, one’s parents basically took care of the giving to the church “for” the children. They would give them a coin to bring each week (now that is a good thing and an important teaching tool). But seems that as many become adults, that concept has lingered, the idea that someone else is taking care of funding the church. That “someone else” is now “us.”

The second is this: “What to give is determined by: (1) how much we love Christ and others; (2) our personal awareness of the needs of the church and the importance of the role of the church in the world today; (3) our willingness to sacrifice; (4) realizing that our regular and sacrificial giving is a measure of our personal gratitude toward God.”

In August, I preached about the healing ministry of the church and how our health, past negative memories, relationships with others, our mental and emotional attitudes, and our spiritual life, are ALL CONNECTED. One affects the other. Same is true in the stewardship of giving. Our giving is connected to all of life, our attitudes about things and possessions, our attitudes about others and above all it is connected to our relationship with Jesus Christ. Our need (spiritually) to give is greater than the church’s need for money. Make our joyful stewardship campaign a matter of prayer this month. Hope to see you at church on Sunday.

Each year, our church has a time of special emphasis on stewardship. You will be invited to dedicate your “Estimate of Giving” card to God at either worship service on Sunday, November 2 (Commitment Sunday), which is also “All Saints Sunday.” Then, Sunday, November 9, will be “Gratitude Sunday” when we give thanks for the faithfulness of God’s people and His blessings on us. You are invited to be in prayer for our stewardship campaign.

The Winston-Salem District of the United Methodist Church has given all churches a challenge to respond to the Great Commission by supporting The Children's Home in Winston-Salem at 1001 Reynolda Road. The W-S District has asked each person to support this effort by giving \$6.00 each.

Children's Home, Inc. has cared for children, families, and individuals in need for nearly 100 years. With campuses in Winston Salem and Franklin, The Home has served Western North Carolina by being the place "Where Children and Families Matter Most." They offer residential programs as well as day centers and counseling for children and families. The Children's Home continues to reach those in need, embracing its mission "to grow healthy futures for children, adults and families by ministering to the mind, body and spirit," and heeding the words of Jesus, "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these, my brethren, you did it unto me."

- \_\_\_ Scouring Pads such as Brillo Pads, SOS Pads, etc...

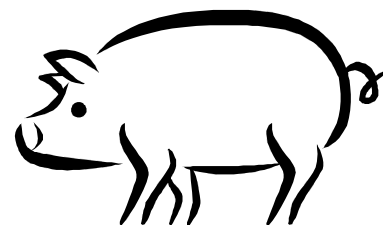
Senior Services has given us permission to distribute donated copies of The Holy Bible in the cleaning supply boxes. Please keep this in mind when making your purchases.
