Lewisville United Methodist Church now sells Food Lion Gift Cards as a fundraiser for the church Building Fund.

It works like this: The church purchases the cards from Food Lion and receives a 5% discount. When cards are purchased from the church, they are sold at face value as \$100.00 or \$50.00 cards. The purchaser gets full value from the cards when shopping at Food Lion.

What an easy way to help our church retire the Building Fund debt. While 5% may not sound like much, it adds up over time. One example would be if 20 families purchased a \$100.00 FL gift card per week, the church would benefit by \$5200.00 each year. Also, you may know of a family that would benefit from a gift card especially during the Christmas season.

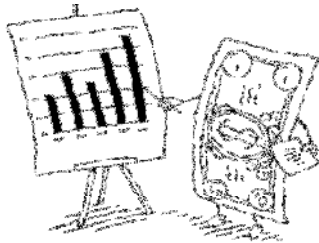

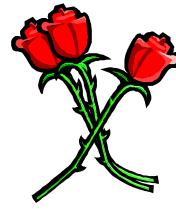

A teenager was questioning his grandfather about what times were like during the War. The grandfather related many experiences he'd had as a soldier as well as the reactions of families and friends waiting at home for news of loved ones. He told his grandson that many people who had sons serving their country displayed stars in the windows of their homes. When a family lost a son in the War, they displayed a gold star. Two conflicting emotions existed side by side in those homes: one was joy and pride in a son who would give his life for his country; the other was great sadness over the loss of a son.

What are our emotions when we think of the Star of Bethlehem? The first is joy, for the prophecy has been fulfilled. It was His star that the Magi followed and with joy-filled adoration they bowed at His feet, offering their gifts. What were the emotions of God the Father as He looked down from Heaven? Did He feel joy and pride in a Son willing to give His life for those He loves? Was that joy eclipsed by pain and sadness that such a sacrifice is necessary?

We can't think of the star without also pondering the cross. While the star led the Wise Men to Jesus, it is the cross that brings us to Jesus' feet. We can't separate Christmas from the cross as we remember why Jesus came in the first place. Scripture reminds us that Jesus, for the joy set before Him, endured the cross for our sakes, to free us from sin and death, in order that we might be His forever. We rejoice in Him, Jesus, our bright Morning Star. My wish is for you and yours to have a very blessed Christmas.

The Stewardship Committee requests our congregation to turn in their "Estimate of Giving" cards by the end of the year. This helps your church plan better for next year and helps you to be a more faithful Christian steward. If you have not turned one in yet, extra cards can be found in various places or call the church office and we'll send one.

LEWISVILLE UMC BUILDING FUND REPORT

At the beginning of 2007, our Building Fund Loan Balance was \$496,000. Over this year we have been able to pay down that loan balance by \$59,000, leaving a current loan of \$437,000. We pay interest charges on the average of \$3,045 per month. Our interest rate is less than the prime rate and thus is variable. We have three years left on the loan note and our payments are "interest only." If we make the same annual contribution for the next three years, we will be \$272,000 short of paying off the construction loan when the note is due. **Our need is to pay as much on the principal as is possible each month.** The more we chisel away at the principal, the lower the interest payment becomes, and therefore there is more we can put toward the principal.

As the year ends, consider a special Christmas gift to the Lewisville UMC Building Fund and help us reduce the principal. Thanks to all those who have faithfully contributed to the Building Fund this year. We have enjoyed the new building and it has enhanced our church and provided us new opportunities for ministry.

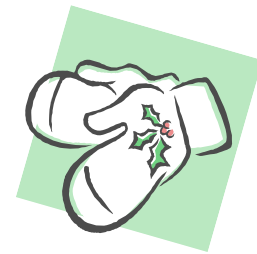

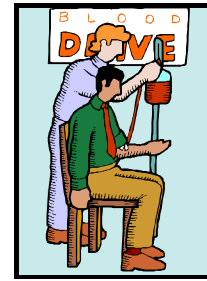
